# GYPI 2019

Two initiatives under one call: Gender Promotion Initiative (GPI) & Youth Promotion Initiative (YPI)

- GPI:
  - Supports implementation of SG's Seven-Point Action Plan on Gender-Responsive Peacebuilding & SC resolutions on WPS
  - Recognizes that women's participation improves peacebuilding outcomes and gender-responsive approaches can better address root causes
- YPI:
  - Supports the SC resolutions 2250 (2015) and 2419 (2018) on YPS & findings/recommendations from the Missing Peace
  - Recognizes the importance of investing in the positive role of young women and men as agents of peace

# UN & CSO Applicants

- UNCTs
  - maximum two proposals per initiative per UNCT (so max 4 in total)
  - grants between \$800,000 and \$1,5 million per project
  - up to 3 UN entities per project
  - need to be endorsed by RC/(D)SRSG
- CSOs
  - maximum two proposals per initiative per CSO globally (so max 4 in total)
  - grants between \$300,000 and \$1,5 million per project
  - only one CSO applicant per project
  - need to meet all eligibility criteria



# CSO Eligibility

- Proof of **previously received funding** from the PBF, UN, or any of the contributors to the PBF in the country
- Proof of **current valid formal registration** as non-profit/charity and tax-exempt organization with a social mission in the country & country of HQ
- Latest **annual report** that includes the activities of the country
- Audited **financial statements** of the last two years (2017 and 2018) including the activities & budgets in the country and auditor letter
- An annual CSO budget in the country that is at least **twice** the annualized budget sought from the PBF
- An annual budget of at least **\$400,000** in the country
- At least **3 years of experience** in the country
- An explanation of CSO's legal structure



# Guidelines

- Applications to be submitted in English, French or Spanish (depending on country context)
- Projects up to 18 months
- At least 5-7% of budget set aside for M&E
- Projects must be prepared together with local partners (at least 40% of the budget allocated to local/national CSOs)
- Projects must contribute to existing national strategies and complement PBF portfolio in country
- GPI projects must be GM 3 and YPI projects must be at least GM 2



# Review Criteria

- Peacebuilding rationale
- Innovation!
- Local partnership and consultation
- Gender- and age-sensitive conflict analysis
- Targeting of young people and/or women
- Focused and realistic interventions
- Logic between conflict analysis, theory of change, intervention, activities and results
- Implementation capacity
- Value-for-money





# Timeline

## Stage 1

- Deadline online concept note submissions on May 20<sup>th</sup> at 23:59 (NY time) via [www.pbfgyipi.org](http://www.pbfgyipi.org)
- Review process & PAC 1: June
- Results: mid-July

## Stage 2

- Full proposals in regular PBF project document format: six weeks after results to [info@pbfgyipi.org](mailto:info@pbfgyipi.org)
- Review process & PAC 2: end of September
- Funds disbursement: November
